ABSTRACT

This thesis aims to study basic information on water resources management in crisis of Thailand. The objective of this study is concepts, principles and public legal theories concerning the management of water resources in a crisis by the state and study the laws governing the management of water resources in foreign countries and Thailand. Include analysis of legal problems on water resources management in a crisis by the state. Also, study appropriate solutions to problems arising from the management of water resources in a crisis by the state.

The study found that since the enforcement of the law on water resources management in Thailand, there are still problems in this regard as follows: (1) Legal problems on the establishment of legal measures to determine the right of access to water resources. Because Thailand does not have the right to use water in each sector should be determined to use enough water for the agriculture and livelihood. (2) Legal problems on Licensing to benefit from appropriate water resources in Thailand. In the present, Thailand does not have a permit to provide benefits in appropriate water resources. As the result of this thesis, it is a problem of water resources in each sector. And (3) Legal problems on community participation and people in water resources conservation. At present, there isn't community and people to revive water resources.

Therefore, Thailand should enact the Act on Water Resources Management. It has the essence of determining the right of access to water resources for water users and the establishment the rules, conditions and procedures for licensing water user organizations to access water resources in

Thailand should be defined. Including community and public participation in the conservation of water resources by bringing concepts, theories and international law to adapt to the laws of Thailand. In order for Thailand to solve the problem.
