ABSTRACT

The objective of the research is to amend an Act on Military Service for the concrete protection of human rights of those conscripted into the military. The research methodology to collect and analysis data is qualitative research consisting of Documentary research; In-depth Interview; Participatory Design, Co-Design; and Hearing. The result of research led to the development of a law on the model of military conscription.

The results of the research revealed that the Military Service Act B.E. 2497 contains provisions that are inappropriate for the context of politics, governance, economy and Thai society today. The amendment of law on the military service model consisting of qualification of a conscripted Military; registration in the reserved personnel list, exception of conscription; selection method; training and duty process; liability; benefits; conscription agency to protect human rights of conscripted.

The research recommends to amend the Military Service Act B.E. 2497 by adding the provisions according to the issues from the research findings; preparation a draft Ministerial Regulation for the implementation of the amended Military Service Act B.E. 2497.
